 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Department of Vet-5 erans Affairs Information Technology Reform Act of

6 2019".

1 SEC. 2. MANAGEMENT OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-

2 FAIRS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY 3 PROJECTS.

4 (a) UPDATE OF REVIEW PROCESS AND INFORMA5 TION TECHNOLOGY DASHBOARD CHIEF INFORMATION
6 OFFICER RATINGS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall update the review
process for information technology projects of the
Department of Veterans Affairs to ensure that active risks are factored into the Information Technology Dashboard Chief Information Officer ratings.

14 (2) REVIEW BY COMPTROLLER GENERAL OF
15 THE UNITED STATES.—Not later than one year after
16 the date on which the Secretary completes updating
17 the review process under paragraph (1), the Comp18 troller General of the United States shall complete
19 a review such process.

20 (b) ANNUAL REPORT ON PROJECT BUDGET DIS21 CREPANCIES.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Each fiscal year, not later
than 120 days after the end of the previous fiscal
year, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee
on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the Committee
mittee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Rep-

resentatives a report on covered information technology projects of the Department with respect to which the amounts that were obligated and the amounts expended by the Department in that fiscal year were, in aggregate, 10 percent or more greater or less than the amount budgeted for the project in that fiscal year.

8 (2)COVERED INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY 9 PROJECTS.—For purposes of this subsection, a cov-10 ered information technology project of the Depart-11 ment is an information technology project of the De-12 partment for which the Secretary estimates the De-13 partment will expend or obligate \$25,000,000 or 14 more for development and sustainment over a three-15 year lifecycle.

16 (3) MITIGATION PLANS.—Each report sub17 mitted under paragraph (1) shall include, for each
18 project described in the report, a plan to rectify the
19 budget discrepancy and improve the accuracy of the
20 budget formulation process of the Department.

21 SEC. 3. PLAN FOR EXPENDITURES RELATING TO DEPART22 MENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS INFORMATION
23 TECHNOLOGY PROJECTS AND INVESTMENTS.
24 (a) PLAN REQUIRED.—

1	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans
2	Affairs shall submit to the appropriate committees
3	of Congress a plan for expenditures of the Depart-
4	ment of Veterans Affairs relating to large informa-
5	tion technology projects and investments.
6	(2) CONTENTS.—The report submitted under
7	paragraph (1) shall include the following:
8	(A) Identification of each information tech-
9	nology project and investment planned by the
10	Secretary for which the Secretary estimates the
11	Department will expend or obligate
12	\$25,000,000 or more for development and
13	sustainment over a three-year lifecycle.
14	(B) For each such project and investment,
15	a description of—
16	(i) the functional and performance ca-
17	pabilities to be delivered and the mission
18	benefits to be realized;
19	(ii) the estimated lifecycle cost, includ-
20	ing estimates for development as well as
21	maintenance and operations; and
22	(iii) key milestones to be met.
23	(C) Demonstration that each project and
24	investment is—

1	(i) consistent with the Information
2	Technology Modernization Plan of the De-
3	partment, or successor plan;
4	(ii) being managed in accordance with
5	applicable lifecycle management policies
6	and guidance; and
7	(iii) subject to applicable planning and
8	investment control requirements of the De-
9	partment.
10	(D) A statement as to whether the plan
11	has been reviewed by the Comptroller General
12	of the United States.
13	(b) Definition of Appropriate Committees of
14	CONGRESS.—In this section, the term "appropriate com-
15	mittees of Congress' means—
16	(1) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs and the

to Congress in support of the Department of Veterans Af fairs budget for a fiscal year (as submitted with the budg et of the President for such fiscal year under section
 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code), such budget jus tification materials include a specific accounting, including
 life cycle costs, of all funds requested for the information
 technology programs of the Department.

8 SEC. 5. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS COMPLIANCE 9 WITH OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET 10 DATA CENTER OPTIMIZATION INITIATIVE.

(a) REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall ensure that the Department of Veterans Affairs
complies with all applicable requirements of the Data Center Optimization Initiative (DCOI) of the Office of Management and Budget, including by—

- 16 (1) fully identifying the data center inventory of17 the Department; and
- (2) meeting any targets assigned by the Director of the Office of Management and Budget pursuant to such initiative regarding data center closures,
 optimization savings, and optimization metrics.

(b) PLAN FOR COMPLIANCE.—Not later than 90 days
after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
shall submit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the

House of Representatives a plan to fully comply with the
 requirements described in subsection (a).

3 (c) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than March 31, 4 2020, and in March of each year thereafter until the date 5 on which the Director of the Office of Management and Budget determines that the Department is in full compli-6 7 ance with the requirements of the initiative referred to in 8 subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the Com-9 mittee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Representa-10 tives a report on the progress of the Secretary in carrying 11 out the plan submitted under subsection (b). 12

13 SEC. 6. ANNUAL LIST OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF14 FAIRS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY 15 PROJECTS.

(a) ANNUAL LIST.—Not less frequently than once
each year, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall submit
to the appropriate committees of Congress a comprehensive, prioritized list of all information technology projects
being funded by the Department of Veterans Affairs,
disaggregated by business line or portfolio division.

(b) DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES OF
CONGRESS.—In this section, the term "appropriate committees of Congress" means—

(1) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs and the
 Committee on Appropriations of the Senate; and
 (2) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs and the
 Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep resentatives.
 SEC. 7. ASSESSMENT OF SUITABILITY OF DEPARTMENT OF
 VETERANS AFFAIRS INFORMATION TECH-

8 NOLOGY INVESTMENTS FOR MIGRATION TO 9 CLOUD COMPUTING SERVICE.

10 (a) Assessment Required.—Not later than one year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-11 retary of Veterans Affairs, acting through the Chief Infor-12 13 mation Officer of the Department of Veterans Affairs, shall complete an assessment, in accordance with guidance 14 15 from the Office of Management and Budget, of all information technology investments of the Department of Vet-16 erans Affairs to determine the suitability of the invest-17 18 ments for migration to a cloud computing service.

(b) MECHANISM TO TRACK SAVINGS.—The Secretary shall create a consistent and repeatable mechanism
to track savings and cost avoidances from—

(1) migration of information technology invest-ments to cloud computing services; and

24 (2) deployment of cloud computing services.

1 (c) REPORT ON SPENDING.—Not later than 180 days 2 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary, 3 acting through the Chief, shall submit to the appropriate 4 committees of Congress a report on spending by the De-5 partment on information technology investments, 6 disaggregated by information technology investment.

7 (d) DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES OF
8 CONGRESS.—In this section, the term "appropriate com9 mittees of Congress" means—

10 (1) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs and the11 Committee on Appropriations of the Senate; and

(2) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs and the
Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives.

15SEC. 8. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS INFORMA-16TION TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT POLICIES17WITH RESPECT TO ROLE OF CHIEF INFORMA-18TION OFFICER.

9	In order to improve information security programs of
10	the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Secretary of Vet-
11	erans Affairs shall develop a continuous monitoring strat-
12	egy that addresses the following:
13	(1) Organization-defined metrics.
14	(2) Frequency of monitoring metrics.
15	(3) Ongoing status monitoring of metrics.
16	(4) Reporting of security status.
17	SEC. 10. REVISION OF PROCESSES OF DEPARTMENT OF
18	VETERANS AFFAIRS OFFICE OF INFORMA-
19	TION AND TECHNOLOGY RELATING TO RISK
20	MANAGEMENT.
21	(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the
22	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Vet-
23	erans Affairs, acting through the Chief Information Offi-
24	cer of the Department of Veterans Affairs, shall revise the
25	processes of the Office of Information and Technology of

the Department relating to risk management to include
 the following:

3 (1) Determining costs and benefits of imple-4 menting the risk mitigation plan for each risk.

5 (2) Collecting performance measures on risk6 handling activities.

7 (b) REVIEW BY COMPTROLLER GENERAL OF THE
8 UNITED STATES.—Not later than 180 days after the date
9 of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General of
10 the United States shall complete a review of the processes
11 revised pursuant to subsection (a).

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
