AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to provide for the conduct of annual evaluations of mental health care and suicide prevention programs of the Department of Veterans Affairs, to require a pilot program on loan repayment for psychiatrists who agree to serve in the Veterans Health Administration of the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Clay Hunt Suicide Pre3 vention for American Veterans Act" or the "Clay Hunt
4 SAV Act".

5 SEC. 2. EVALUATIONS OF MENTAL HEALTH CARE AND SUI6 CIDE PREVENTION PROGRAMS OF DEPART7 MENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.

8 (a) EVALUATIONS.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter I of chapter 17
10 of title 38, United States Code, is amended by add11 ing at the end the following new section:

12 "§1709B. Evaluations of mental health care and suicide prevention programs

"(a) EVALUATIONS.—(1) Not less frequently than
once during each period specified in paragraph (3), the
Secretary shall provide for the conduct of an evaluation
of the mental health care and suicide prevention programs
carried out under the laws administered by the Secretary.
"(2) Each evaluation conducted under paragraph (1)
shall—

21 "(A) use metrics that are common among and
22 useful for practitioners in the field of mental health
23 care and suicide prevention;

24 "(B) identify the most effective mental health25 care and suicide prevention programs conducted by

1	the Secretary, including such programs conducted at
2	a Center of Excellence;
3	"(C) identify the cost-effectiveness of each pro-
4	gram identified under subparagraph (B);
5	"(D) measure the satisfaction of patients with
6	respect to the care provided under each such pro-
7	gram; and
8	"(E) propose best practices for caring for indi-
9	viduals who suffer from mental health disorders or
10	are at risk of suicide, including such practices con-
11	ducted or suggested by other departments or agen-
12	cies of the Federal Government, including the Sub-
13	stance Abuse and Mental Health Services Adminis-
14	tration of the Department of Health and Human
15	Services.
16	((3) The periods specified in this paragraph are the
17	following:
18	"(A) The period beginning on the date on which
19	the Secretary awards the contract under paragraph
20	(4) and ending on September 30, 2018.
21	"(B) Each fiscal year beginning on or after Oc-
22	tober 1, 2018.
23	"(4) Not later than 180 days after the date of the
24	enactment of this section, the Secretary shall seek to enter
25	into a contract with an independent third party unaffili-

ated with the Department of Veterans Affairs to conduct
 evaluations under paragraph (1).

3 "(5) The independent third party that is awarded the
4 contract under paragraph (4) shall submit to the Sec5 retary each evaluation conducted under paragraph (1).

6 "(b) ANNUAL SUBMISSION.—Not later than Decem-7 ber 1, 2018, and each year thereafter, the Secretary shall 8 submit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Sen-9 ate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House 10 of Representatives a report that contains the following:

"(1) The most recent evaluations submitted to
the Secretary under subsection (a)(5) that the Secretary has not previously submitted to such Committees.

15 "(2) Any recommendations the Secretary con-16 siders appropriate.".

17 (2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec18 tions at the beginning of such chapter is amended
19 by inserting after the item relating to section 1709A
20 the following new item:

"1709B. Evaluations of mental health care and suicide prevention programs.".

(b) INTERIM REPORTS.—Not later than September
30 of each of 2016 and 2017, the Secretary of Veterans
Affairs, in coordination with the independent third party
awarded a contract by the Secretary pursuant to section
1709B(a)(4) of title 38, United States Code, as added by
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1	subsection (a)(1), shall submit to the Committee on Vet-
2	erans' Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on Vet-
3	erans' Affairs of the House of Representatives a report
4	on the mental health care and suicide prevention programs
5	carried out under the laws administered by the Secretary
6	that includes, with respect to each such program, the fol-
7	lowing:
8	(1) A description of the program.
9	(2) The number of veterans served by the pro-
10	gram.
11	(3) The budget of the program.
12	(4) The number of full-time equivalent employ-
13	ees assigned to the program.
14	(5) Whether veterans may repeat participation
15	in the program or participate in the program in ad-
16	dition to other similar programs.
17	(6) Any study results or research published re-
18	conding the officient of the program
	garding the efficacy of the program.
19	(7) Any other information the Secretary deter-

websites of the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Sec retary shall survey the existing Internet websites and in formation resources of the Department to publish an
 Internet website that serves as a centralized source to pro vide veterans with information regarding all of the mental
 health care services provided by the Secretary.

7 (b) ELEMENTS.—The Internet website published 8 under subsection (a) shall provide to veterans information 9 regarding all of the mental health care services available 10 in the Veteran Integrated Service Network that the veteran is seeking such services, including, with respect to 11 12 each medical center, Vet Center (as defined in section 13 1712A of title 38, United States Code), and communitybased outpatient center in the Veterans Integrated Service 14 15 Network—

- 16 (1) the name and contact information of each17 social work office;
- 18 (2) the name and contact information of each19 mental health clinic;
- 20 (3) a list of appropriate staff; and
- 21 (4) any other information the Secretary deter-22 mines appropriate.

23 (c) UPDATED INFORMATION.—The Secretary shall24 ensure that the information described in subsection (b)

that is published on the Internet website under subsection
 (a) is updated not less than once every 90 days.

3 (d) OUTREACH.—In carrying out this section, the 4 Secretary shall ensure that the outreach conducted under 5 section 1720F(i) of title 38, United States Code, includes 6 information regarding the Internet website published 7 under subsection (a).

8 SEC. 4. PILOT PROGRAM FOR REPAYMENT OF EDU-9 CATIONAL LOANS FOR CERTAIN PSYCHIA-10 TRISTS OF VETERANS HEALTH ADMINISTRA-11 TION.

(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary of Veterans
Affairs shall carry out a pilot program to repay loans of
individuals described in subsection (b) that—

(1) were used by such individuals to finance
education relating to psychiatric medicine, including
education leading to—

18 (A) a degree of doctor of medicine; or
19 (B) a degree of doctor of osteopathy; and
20 (2) were obtained from any of the following:
21 (A) A governmental entity.
22 (B) A private financial institution.
23 (C) A school.

24 (D) Any other authorized entity as deter-25 mined by the Secretary.

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1	(b) ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.—
2	(1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (2), an
3	individual eligible for participation in the pilot pro-
4	gram is an individual who—
5	(A) either—
6	(i) is licensed or eligible for licensure
7	to practice psychiatric medicine in the Vet-
8	erans Health Administration of the De-
9	partment of Veterans Affairs; or
10	(ii) is enrolled in the final year of a
11	residency program leading to a specialty
12	qualification in psychiatric medicine that is
13	approved by the Accreditation Council for
14	Graduate Medical Education; and
15	(B) demonstrates a commitment to a long-
16	term career as a psychiatrist in the Veterans
17	Health Administration, as determined by the
18	Secretary.
19	(2) PROHIBITION ON SIMULTANEOUS ELIGI-
20	BILITY.—An individual who is participating in any
21	other program of the Federal Government that re-
22	pays the educational loans of the individual is not el-
23	igible to participate in the pilot program.
24	(c) Selection.—The Secretary shall select not less
25	than 10 individuals described in subsection (b) to partici-

pate in the pilot program for each year in which the Sec retary carries out the pilot program.

3 (d) PERIOD OF OBLIGATED SERVICE.—The Sec4 retary shall enter into an agreement with each individual
5 selected under subsection (c) in which such individual
6 agrees to serve a period of 2 or more years of obligated
7 service for the Veterans Health Administration in the field
8 of psychiatric medicine, as determined by the Secretary.
9 (e) LOAN REPAYMENTS.—

10 (1) AMOUNTS.—Subject to paragraph (2), a 11 loan repayment under this section may consist of 12 payment of the principal, interest, and related ex-13 penses of a loan obtained by an individual who is 14 participating in the pilot program for all educational 15 expenses (including tuition, fees, books, and labora-16 tory expenses) of such individual relating to edu-17 cation described in subsection (a)(1).

18 (2) LIMIT.—For each year of obligated service
19 that an individual who is participating in the pilot
20 program agrees to serve under subsection (d), the
21 Secretary may pay not more than \$30,000 in loan
22 repayment on behalf of such individual.

23 (f) BREACH.—

24 (1) LIABILITY.—An individual who participates
25 in the pilot program and fails to satisfy the period

1 of obligated service under subsection (d) shall be lia-2 ble to the United States, in lieu of such obligated 3 service, for the amount that has been paid or is pay-4 able to or on behalf of the individual under the pilot 5 program, reduced by the proportion that the number 6 of days served for completion of the period of obli-7 gated service bears to the total number of days in 8 the period of obligated service of such individual.

9 (2) REPAYMENT PERIOD.—Any amount of dam-10 ages that the United States is entitled to recover 11 under this subsection shall be paid to the United 12 States not later than 1 year after the date of the 13 breach of the agreement.

14 (g) REPORT.—

(1) INITIAL REPORT.—Not later than 2 years
after the date on which the pilot program under subsection (a) commences, the Secretary shall submit to
the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate
and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
House of Representatives a report on the pilot program.

22 (2) ELEMENTS.—The report required by para-23 graph (1) shall include the following:

(A) The number of individuals who partici-
pated in the pilot program, including the num-
ber of new hires.
(B) The locations in which such individuals
were employed by the Department, including
how many such locations were rural or urban
locations.
(C) An assessment of the quality of the
work performed by such individuals in the
course of such employment, including the per-
formance reviews of such individuals.
(D) The number of psychiatrists the Sec-
retary determines is needed by the Department
in the future.
(3) FINAL REPORT.—Not later than 90 days
before the date on which the pilot program termi-
nates under subsection (i), the Secretary shall sub-
mit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of
the House of Representatives an update to the re-
port submitted under paragraph (1) and any rec-
ommendations that the Secretary considers appro-
priate.
(h) REGULATIONS.—The Secretary shall prescribe

25 regulations to carry out this section, including standards

for qualified loans and authorized payees and other terms
 and conditions for the making of loan repayments.

3 (i) TERMINATION.—The authority to carry out the
4 pilot program shall expire on the date that is 3 years after
5 the date on which the Secretary commences the pilot pro6 gram.

7 SEC. 5. PILOT PROGRAM ON COMMUNITY OUTREACH.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs 9 shall establish a pilot program to assist veterans 10 transitioning from serving on active duty and to improve 11 the access of veterans to mental health services.

(b) LOCATIONS.—The Secretary shall carry out the
pilot program under subsection (a) at not less than five
Veterans Integrated Service Networks that have a large
population of veterans who—

16 (1) served in the reserve components of the17 Armed Forces; or

(2) are transitioning into communities with an
established population of veterans after having recently separated from the Armed Forces.

(c) FUNCTIONS.—The pilot program at each Veterans Integrated Service Network described in subsection
(b) shall include the following:

24 (1) A community oriented veteran peer support25 network, carried out in partnership with an appro-

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2	grams, that—
3	(A) establishes peer support training
4	guidelines;
5	(B) develops a network of veteran peer
6	support counselors to meet the demands of the
7	communities in the Veterans Integrated Service
8	Network;
9	(C) conducts training of veteran peer sup-
10	port counselors;
11	(D) with respect to one medical center se-
12	lected by the Secretary in each such Veterans
13	Integrated Service Network, has—
14	(i) a designated peer support spe-
15	cialist who acts as a liaison to the commu-
16	nity oriented veteran peer network; and
17	(ii) a certified mental health profes-
18	sional designated as the community ori-
19	ented veteran peer network mentor; and
20	(E) is readily available to veterans, includ-
21	ing pursuant to the Veterans Integrated Service
22	Network cooperating and working with State
23	and local governments and appropriate entities.

1	(2) A community outreach team for each med-
2	ical center selected by the Secretary pursuant to
3	paragraph $(1)(D)$ that—
4	(A) assists veterans transitioning into com-
5	munities;
6	(B) establishes a veteran transition advi-
7	sory group to facilitate outreach activities;
8	(C) includes the participation of appro-
9	priate community organizations, State and local
10	governments, colleges and universities, cham-
11	bers of commerce and other local business orga-
12	nizations, and organizations that provide legal
13	aid or advice; and
14	(D) coordinates with the Veterans Inte-
15	grated Service Network regarding the Veterans
16	Integrated Service Network carrying out an an-
17	nual mental health summit to assess the status
18	of veteran mental health care in the community
19	and to develop new or innovative means to pro-
20	vide mental health services to veterans.
21	(d) Reports.—
22	(1) INITIAL REPORT.—Not later than 18
23	months after the date on which the pilot program
24	under subsection (a) commences, the Secretary shall
25	submit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the

1	Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of
2	the House of Representatives a report on the pilot
3	program. With respect to each Veterans Integrated
4	Service Network described in subsection (b), the re-
5	port shall include—
6	(A) a full description of the peer support
7	model implemented under the pilot program,
8	participation data, and data pertaining to past
9	and current mental health related hospitaliza-
10	tions and fatalities;
11	(B) recommendations on implementing
12	peer support networks throughout the Depart-
13	ment;
14	(C) whether the mental health resources
15	made available under the pilot program for
16	members of the reserve components of the
17	Armed Forces is effective; and
18	(D) a full description of the activities and
19	effectiveness of community outreach coordi-
20	nating teams under the pilot program, including
21	partnerships that have been established with
22	appropriate entities.
23	(2) FINAL REPORT.—Not later than 90 days
24	before the date on which the pilot program termi-
25	nates under subsection (e), the Secretary shall sub-

mit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
 Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of
 the House of Representatives an update to the re port submitted under paragraph (1).

5 (e) CONSTRUCTION.—This section may not be con6 strued to authorize the Secretary to hire additional em7 ployees of the Department to carry out the pilot program
8 under subsection (a).

9 (f) TERMINATION.—The authority of the Secretary to 10 carry out the pilot program under subsection (a) shall ter-11 minate on the date that is 3 years after the date on which 12 the pilot program commences.

13 SEC. 6. COLLABORATION ON SUICIDE PREVENTION EF-14FORTS BETWEEN DEPARTMENT OF VET-15ERANS AFFAIRS AND NON-PROFIT MENTAL16HEALTH ORGANIZATIONS.

17 (a) COLLABORATION.—The Secretary of Veterans Af18 fairs may collaborate with non-profit mental health orga19 nizations to prevent suicide among veterans as follows:

(1) To improve the efficiency and effectiveness
of suicide prevention efforts carried out by the Secretary and non-profit mental health organizations.

(2) To assist non-profit mental health organizations with the suicide prevention efforts of such or-

ganizations through the use of the expertise of em ployees of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

3 (3) To jointly carry out suicide prevention ef-4 forts.

5 (b) EXCHANGE OF RESOURCES.—In carrying out any 6 collaboration under subsection (a), the Secretary and any 7 non-profit mental health organization with which the Sec-8 retary is collaborating under such subsection shall ex-9 change training sessions and best practices to help with 10 the suicide prevention efforts of the Department and such 11 organization.

12 (c) DIRECTOR OF SUICIDE PREVENTION COORDINA-13 TION.—The Secretary shall select within the Department a Director of Suicide Prevention Coordination to under-14 15 take any collaboration with non-profit mental health organizations under this section or any other provision of law. 16 17 SEC. 7. ADDITIONAL PERIOD OF ELIGIBILITY FOR HEALTH 18 CARE FOR CERTAIN VETERANS OF COMBAT 19 SERVICE DURING CERTAIN PERIODS OF HOS-20 TILITIES AND WAR.

21 Paragraph (3) of section 1710(e) of title 38, United
22 States Code, is amended to read as follows:

23 "(3) In the case of care for a veteran described in24 paragraph (1)(D), hospital care, medical services, and

nursing home care may be provided under or by virtue
 of subsection (a)(2)(F) only during the following periods:

"(A) Except as provided by subparagraph (B),
with respect to a veteran described in paragraph
(1)(D) who is discharged or released from the active
military, naval, or air service after January 27,
2003, the five-year period beginning on the date of
such discharge or release.

9 "(B) With respect to a veteran described in 10 paragraph (1)(D) who is discharged or released from 11 the active military, naval, or air service after Janu-12 ary 1, 2009, and before January 1, 2011, but did 13 not enroll to receive such hospital care, medical serv-14 ices, or nursing home care pursuant to such para-15 graph during the five-year period described in sub-16 paragraph (A), the one-year period beginning on the 17 date of the enactment of the Clay Hunt Suicide Pre-18 vention for American Veterans Act.

"(C) With respect to a veteran described in
paragraph (1)(D) who is discharged or released from
the active military, naval, or air service on or before
January 27, 2003, and did not enroll in the patient
enrollment system under section 1705 of this title on
or before such date, the three-year period beginning
on January 27, 2008.".

1 SEC. 8. PROHIBITION ON NEW APPROPRIATIONS.

2 No additional funds are authorized to be appro-3 priated to carry out this Act and the amendments made 4 by this Act, and this Act and such amendments shall be 5 carried out using amounts otherwise made available for 6 such purposes.
